Project Place was pleased to be awarded a grant from the Department of Labor to expand our reentry services. Recognizing that the best way to prevent recidivism is through work, Project Place created the Boston Career Pathway Collaborative (BCPC), a seamless system of training, case management, mentoring, credentialing, education support, job placement and follow-up services geared to the needs of men and women returning from incarceration. Participants identify their individual strengths and weaknesses as they design a clear career pathway. BCPC presents a strategic way of maximizing resources and linking key players to provide comprehensive services. Partnering with the Suffolk County House of Correction, the reentry program will help men and women participating in state or local work-release programs gain the job skills and experience necessary to succeed in growth occupations upon reintegrating back into society. An exciting part of the program includes the involvement of the House of Corrections with local employers in the design phase of the program to host property dispates the shell they need to compate for surrent.

BCPC is the newest addition, complementing the work being done by our other programs serving incarcerated men and women: POWR (Partnerships to Opportunities for Women in Reentry) and our oldest program CREW (Community Reentry for Women), which has been operating with the Suffolk County House of Corrections for 10 years. Beth Carter (*pictured at podium*) is our new Director of Reentry Services. Beth previously worked with the women at Betty's Place, Project Place's rapid rehousing program and has experience as a probation officer and HUD housing certification manager. We are excited for the commitment, energy and insight Beth is bringing to our newest programs.
